through various exciting, innovative activities and interactions with other fellow students. The four day camp was buzzing with laughter, discussions, activities and team work. Activities like Zumba,

hat making, art and craft, playing handball and many more such interesting sessions were designed exclusively for the students. The favourite of them all was the 'Good morning Ahmedabad' session, conducted by an organization called Read to Speak. Children transformed into Radio Jockeys for a day. The team selected the best recordings and composed a complete Pratham Access FM Radio Show.

Summer Camp - An Access India Summer camp was organised at Ambey Valley, near Pune, Maharashtra. Eight


students and two teachers from Pratham Access program were selected for the ten days camp. Students travelled by air for the first time, and were getting a chance to get on a plane, which brought much excitement for them. All the participants of the summer camp stayed at the Ambey valley resort. Students were exposed to several new activities, games, adventure sports, boating, and craft work all done in teams. For most of them the activities

was a first time experience, which they thoroughly enjoyed and shared these activities with other students as well.

Enhancement Activities

- i) Potluck: Children from FD Girls School, Jamalpur brought in different home cooked dishes and shared it amongst themselves and their teachers in the class. Children brought yummy dishes painstakingly prepared by their mothers or them. They learnt the joy of sharing with an open heart. Ms. Neetu Madan ideated the entire session.
- **ii) The Science workshop:** a hands-on science workshop in English language was organized for the students. The workshop was conducted to enhance their understanding of some basic principles of science refraction of light when it passes through different mediums, straw whistle and working of a solar bulb. Students worked in groups and prepared working models and also learnt a lot of new words.
- **iii) Readothon**: As Reading is an important part of developing the English language skills, an activity called 'Readothon' has been introduced to the students. Students are separated into 4 or more groups and are given











reading templates to fill in based on the story they read. They have to read as many books as they can along with understanding the main topic and points of the story. They are then given a quiz related to the story, this makes the children read and understand a book better. Readothon is an initiative by two Polish interns at Pratham, to inculcate the habit of reading among students

Class Curriculum Highlights:

Classroom sessions in Access not only equip children with the skill of the English language but also focus on qualitative knowledge exchange. Between the months of June to August, children learnt about different categories of food – food which is healthy and which is not. Along with focus on the new interactive textbook, children were given various exercises centric to the unit they studied. They prepared grocery lists, bifurcated what they eat into categories of – fat, oil, sugar, vegetables, fruits, dairy, grains, meat and other protein. They also learnt about different foods people eat on different occasions around the world. All the classroom sessions mixed with visits and interactions through events like the Global Village make the understanding deeper and more effective.

Access Alumni Association:

With all the love being poured in by ex Access students it was decided to start the Access Alumni Association (AAA) this year, to stay in touch with ex-students and also to organize sessions for them on career guidance, life skill, etc in the upcoming AAA meetings.

Fifty five students were contacted via phone calls and invited for a Pratham Access alumni meet. Students were overjoyed and felt happy reminiscing their good old days, they shared how much they missed the access classes and how if given a chance they would want to join back! Most of the students were really enthusiastic to be a part of Access again via AAA. They expressed that they miss the environment of Access classes especially for:

- 1. All the fun activities which were done in the class.
- 2. The friendly nature of Access teachers
- 3. The feeling of not being afraid to make mistakes in the Access class!
- 4. All the extracurricular activities like visits to different places, immersion camps, etc.

Fun Learning activities initiated


